

Update September 2023

Welcome to the first Tapton Update of the new school year. The Tapton Update is our school newsletter and will be published in the third week of every half term. The first Update of the new school year is always a busy one as we share with you some of our plans and policies for the academic year.

The Year Ahead

Punctuality

School now starts at 9am; we expect students to be ready to enter the building by 8.55 so they have ample time to get to their form room or assembly by 9am. On a few occasions we have had parents and carers contact school asking for leeway due to traffic issues. Whilst we know bad traffic can be frustrating we have a responsibility to have the highest expectations of our students and therefore students who arrive after 9am will still receive a same day lunchtime detention.

Mobile Phones

As outlined in our earlier communications we have amended our policy on phones and devices. Mobile phones, iPods and other electronic devices such as wireless earphones cannot be visible in the school building at any time – this is non-negotiable. This means that students cannot have a visible phone/earphones/ear pods/cables inside the building at any point of the day from entry to leaving. Devices are also not allowed out during lesson changeover from the main building to the Geography block and the main building to PE. Until further notice students will be able to use devices outside at breaks and lunchtimes and in certain lessons under the supervision of their teachers. Sixth form students will be able to use their devices in the Common Room. If students choose to bring phones/devices to school, they will be encouraged to put them on 'airplane' mode and they must be put into bags before entering the building; students cannot put phones/devices in pockets, this policy also includes cables hanging out of shirts and from pockets, headphones worn around necks. If any student has these prohibited items on show, in pockets, or members of staff can hear them, they will be confiscated without negotiation.

<u>Jewellery</u>

We discourage students from wearing jewellery to school, however, if a student is going to wear jewellery it should be sensible and kept to a minimum in accordance with the following guidelines:

- Earrings should be small and studs only. Large hoops or dangly earrings are a health and safety risk, students are not allowed to not wear these items in school.
- No jewellery should be worn for PE or for out of hours PE activities.
- Please be mindful that if your child is having new piercings, these are done at the start of the school summer holiday; having these done during the school year will interfere with participation in PE and other practical lessons.
- Necklaces should be placed under the Tapton School polo shirt, they should not be visible.

Homework Drop Ins

We firmly believe in the importance of developing good learning routines here at Tapton. The Library is open every day to all students before and after school to support with this. Furthermore, there is extra support at our Homework Drop Ins available at the times advertised below. There will be one to one support from our Key Stage Three and Key Stage Four Academic Mentor, Mr Mekonnen and access to laptops, books and resources. For our Key Stage Three students who live in Netherthorpe and Upperthorpe we are also pleased to provide a minibus drop off service at Zest Community Centre on a Wednesday. Pre-Loved Uniform

We also have a uniform donation box located in the visitor reception area if any families wish to donate good quality, clean uniform items. We are currently taking donations for Tapton logoed sweatshirts, polo shirts, trousers, skirts and especially looking out for larger sized items.

Contributions to the Hardship Fund

Tapton School operate a hardship policy to provide opportunities to students whose families are experiencing genuine and unavoidable financial difficulty. We would like to offer parents the opportunity to contribute to this fund, making it clear that this is entirely voluntary and there is no obligation on you to contribute. However, if you wish to, you can do so using ParentPay, selecting the payment item 'Hardship' and entering the donation value. The funds will only be used to support students experiencing financial hardship and the senior leadership team will decide how the funds will be spent using their discretion and professional judgement.

Attendance to School

There is a direct correlation between excellent attendance to school and outstanding achievement. Now that we have largely emerged from the pandemic, we expect student attendance to be more consistent and to return to our usual high standards. Our school target is to ensure that all students have outstanding attendance with no student having lower than 97% attendance. Please refer to the table below which explains how each percentage attendance figure equates to missed days of learning. 97% attendance whilst seemingly high, is nevertheless five days of lost learning.

Please do not hesitate to contact your child's Year Leader if you need support or advice with your child's attendance. We regularly monitor attendance and we endeavour to empathise and reduce any barriers that may prevent your child from attending school.

Of course, there may be times when your child is too ill to attend school and, in those instances, please do contact school immediately so that we are aware and can support your child if necessary. The current information from the Department for Education advises that children and young people with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education setting.

Tapton School Academy Trust - What to do if you have symptoms of COVID-19

If you or your child have symptoms and either have a high temperature or do not feel well enough to go to school or work, then try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people. You can go back to your normal activities when you feel better or do not have a high temperature. If your child has mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat or mild cough, and they feel well enough, they can go to school or childcare.

Tapton School Academy Trust - What to do if you have tested positive.

You are no longer required to do a COVID-19 test if you have symptoms. But if you or your child test positive for COVID-19:

- try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for **3 days** after the day of the test if you are **under 18** years old.
- try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for **5 days** after the day of the test if you are **18** years old or over.

• avoid meeting people who are more likely to get seriously ill from viruses, i.e., a weakened immune system, for 10 days after the day you took your test.

We work in line with the Department for Education guidance and do not authorise absences from school during term time unless in very rare, exceptional circumstances. These would need to be discussed with your child's Year Leader and evidenced two weeks before your intended leave. A fixed term penalty notice may be issued if students take time off school during term time.

Parking

Parking spaces continue to be limited on the school site; there are insufficient spaces for school staff. We have a parking barrier in operation at the front of the driveway into school. Please note if you need to visit school you will need to park considerately on streets in the surrounding area; please do not drive straight onto the drive assuming you will be able to park as this causes a blockage and potential hazard at the entrance and then onto Darwin Lane. Parents and carers who need to collect students with access issues will be given a pass by the school office upon request. Once again, we must urge families who are collecting children to make plans to collect them on streets away from Darwin Lane – this is a narrow road which must be kept free for school buses, coaches and of course, emergency vehicles. Families and neighbours who have concerns about parking are urged to contact the police.

Personal Development

This half term all students in Key Stage Three will be looking at Equality and Diversity in their Personal Development lessons. They will be studying the legal framework behind this and what this means for them during their time at Tapton. Year 7 students will be studying British Values, the Equality Act, and the protected characteristic of Race and Ethnicity. Year 8 students will study the protected characteristics of Sex, Gender and Gender Reassignment, and Year 9 students will be looking at the protected characteristics of Religion and Belief and looking at the difference between 'Free Speech and Hate Speech'. In Key Stage Four, Year 10 students will be looking at a variety of revision techniques during their form time Personal Development slot to help them with their upcoming assessments and Year 11 will be focusing on post-16 destinations.

The whole school we will be celebrating Black History month in October with the theme of 'Saluting our Sisters'. There will be assemblies to all year groups, displays around the school and students will be invited to take part in a national poetry competition honouring the amazing achievements and contributions of black women in various fields – from literature, music, science, politics, and social care to campaigners, nurses, and everyday heroes who have made a difference to our lives.
