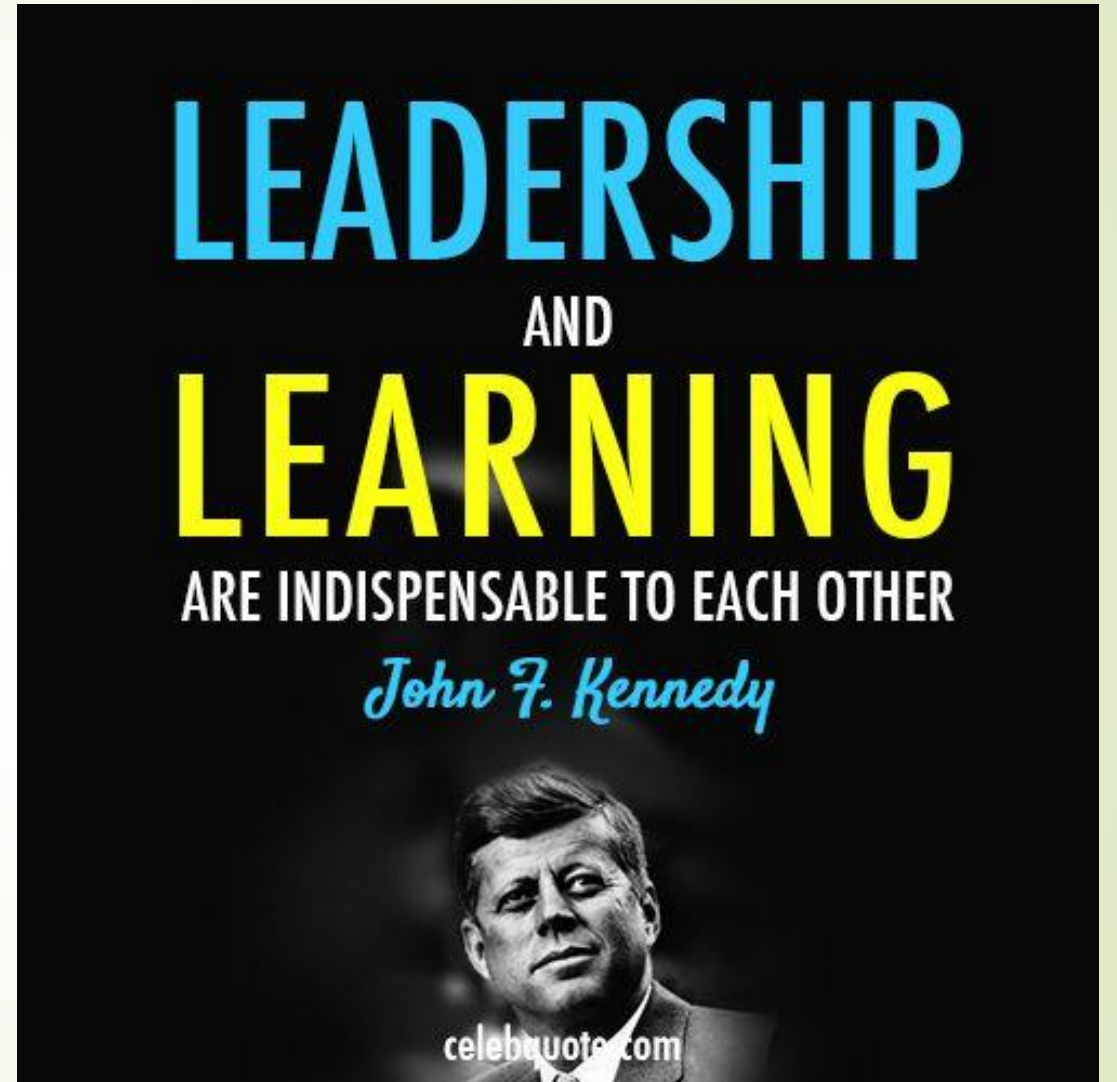
## The Key Stage 3 Student Leadership Challenge 2017

### Aims of the discussion:

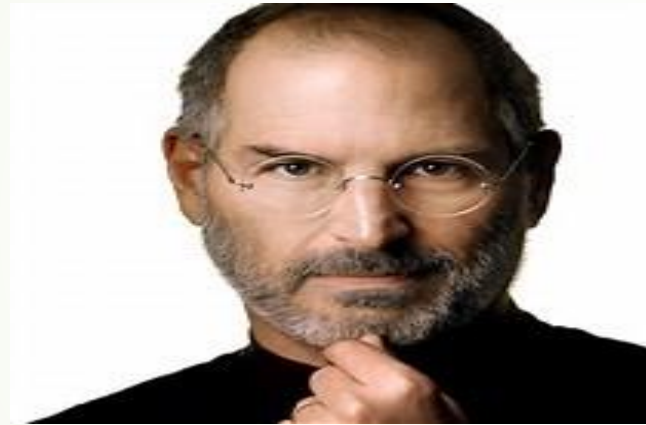
- ▶ For students to share their ideas about what makes an effective leader.

# The challenge consists of five key strands that have been widely recognised to be the foundation of strong and effective leadership

- The five strands are:
- **Model** the way - **set a good example**
- **Inspire** a shared vision – enlist and influence others
- Challenge the process – search for opportunities take responsible risks and **make positive changes**
- Enable others to act – foster collaboration, **help others act responsibly**
- Encourage the heart – **celebrate success** and **recognise the contributions of others**



# Success Criteria (more detail will be shared in the launch assemblies during next half term)

**Bronze:-** Can be achieved through demonstrating leadership skills within form time, lessons and around school. You must demonstrate the required level of leadership skills across **all** the five strands to gain the bronze award.

**Silver:** - You must achieve **all** the bronze criteria across the five strands as well as **all** the silver criteria to achieve the silver award.

**Gold:-** You must achieve **all** of the bronze, silver and gold criteria to achieve the gold standard gold.

Silver and Gold levels require students to demonstrate leadership outside of their lessons either through extra-curricular activities and / or through voluntary work that contributes towards the school community. During the next term the list below shows **some** of the volunteering opportunities within school you could use to achieve the silver and gold levels of the **KS3 Student Leadership Challenge Award:**

- **Voluntary opportunities – Y12 Parents’ Evening 18/01/17, Y9 Parents’ Evening 02/02/17.**
- **PE take over week for KS3 groups (students lead the lessons) WC 13/02/17**
- **Extra curricular programme of activities**
- **Year and Student Council work**
- **Fundraising activities**
- **Other voluntary / community based activities**
