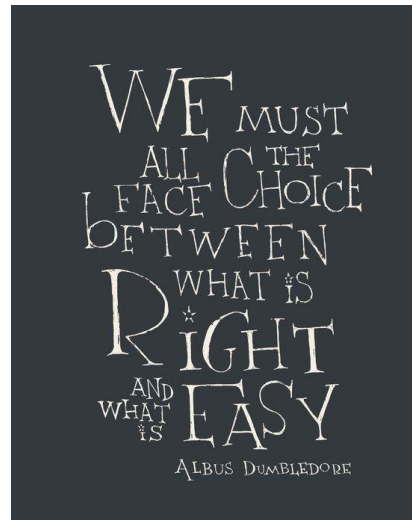


**WELCOME

16-19 Bursary

The 16-19 Bursary is paid to eligible students on a monthly basis dependant on their attendance. Money is paid into your bank account, with a maximum of £80 a month. You will need your own bank account to apply and we have to submit a bank statement as proof of your account.

Free School Meals

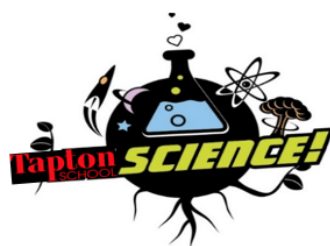
