

## The Role of the Form Tutor

 You will receive more details on your child's form tutor at the Transition After School Club

- Your child will see their form tutor for 20 minutes each morning
- They will ensure that your child is ready for learning
- Form time will include assemblies, reading, our weekly student bulletin and personal development activities.

### Rewards

- Your child will receive merits when they do the right thing
- A student can receive merits for
  - Wearing the correct uniform
  - Bringing the correct equipment
  - Contributing in lessons
  - Helping others
  - Being kind
- When you child receives 150 merits they will bring a letter home. Sign the letter and when your child returns it to school they will receive a white badge and certificate.
- Students also get a badge at 300 merits (purple) and
  450 merits (red).

## Uniform

- A white or black polo shirt with the Tapton logo
- A black sweatshirt or black cardigan with the Tapton logo.
  - If a student chooses to wear a Tapton logoed black jumper, they need to ensure they still wear a plain white or black school wear polo shirt underneath with the collar on show over their jumper.
- A black fleece with the Tapton logo or a plain black fleece.
- Students can wear either flat black full-length trousers, black tailored shorts or a black skirt.
  - However, students cannot wear jogging bottoms, combat trousers, sports material shorts/skirts or leggings.
- All black shoes or trainers without any coloured logo and without different coloured trims (not sandals). Flat all black below the knee boots.
- No hoods or hats are to be worn in the building.
- No jewellery to be on show over the top of Tapton logoed polo shirt, jumper or fleece. Students can wear studs only, no hoops or dangly earrings.
