History	 The assessment will last 45 minutes and be worth a total of 40 marks. It will include questions from Year 7 topics (the Roman Empire and the British Empire) and the current Year 8 topic, Fight For Power (medieval unit only). No notes or books are allowed in the assessment. 	 Students will be issued with a revision guide and will also complete a revision lesson prior to the assessment. There are more details about the types of questions students will face on the front cover of the revision guide.
MFL	 The Year 8 MFL Assessment will last 45 minutes and covers: Listening Reading Writing and translation from English into the Target language 	The papers cover topics studied in Year 7 and throughout Year 8 so far. Exercise books and homework booklets (which contain revision guidance and extra revision exercises) should be used to support revision and MFL teachers will attach any materials/revision power points on Satchel one. During assessment week, students will have a 40-minute assessment marked out of 15. The assessment is based on an extract of text that students have being studying. The questions will focus on how an actor, director and designer each interpret text to communicate meaning.	There will be a revision homework task set before the assessment and all skills are being practised in lessons.
Engineering	The Y8 assessment will be completed online and will include a section of multiple-choice questions, a section of functional maths questions, and a section on manufacturing. The final question will be an extended examstyle written response, similar to what students will experience at GCSE. Revision materials will be provided at least one month before the assessment (see class charts), and students will also take part in a dedicated revision lesson during the week prior to their exam. Textiles	In Textiles students have been working on basic sewing machine skills and have started the research and development stage of their Pop Art bag project. The Year 8 assessment will assess the work completed so far this year. During assessment week or just before students will have a designated improvement and reflection lesson which will allow for completion and improvement of work before the teacher marks the work to give a percentage. There is no revision required but students should ensure that they have completed their mood board homework, and it is stuck in their booklet.	
Food	There will be a 45 minute written assessment. It will cover the following topics - food safety and hygiene, where food comes from, macro and micronutrients and kitchen equipment.	Knowledge organisers will be given to students for revision 4 weeks before the assessment. Students will use information on Classcharts to complete the sections on the revision material. This will be checked after 2 weeks and questions can be asked. Students will then have a further 2 weeks to complete the rest. They will bring their revision sheet on the day of the exam and this work will go into their books.
